A Short Exercise in Praying Scripture

Jesus calls us to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. Loving God with our heart means that we open our emotion and activate our will. The following cycle of prayer invites us to do just that. Plan to read the passage four times. After each reading silently engage the Scripture in the following ways.

FIRST READING: MIND After the first reading focus on one phrase that draws your attention. During the silence, let that phrase settle in your mind. Receive it like a precious seed implanted, imparting the life-giving power of the kingdom of God.

SECOND READING: HEART During the second reading, notice what emotions are present in the passage. Consider how the author's heart may have been stirred as he wrote. Notice what God is inviting you to feel. Take time to linger in those emotions.

THIRD READING: SOUL On the third time through, consciously pray about what you are sensing from this passage. Talk with God about this word of his that is being implanted in you. Lift your emotion, your desire, your longing to the Lord.

FOURTH READING: STRENGTH On the fourth reading, focus on one word that expresses God's intent for you from this passage. What is God inviting you to say "yes!" to? Sit in silence with that word, breathing out your consent. As you do, be aware of God strengthening you in his presence.

WRITTEN RESPONSE Take time to write about your experience with this passage. Write about your thoughts, your feelings, your prayer, your consent to God's intent.


- Whenever you find a passage that addresses your soul's deep need
